

## **Texas English I Eoc Study Guide**

In the 21st century, Texas schools continue to experience exponential growth in their numbers of English language learners (ELLs). At the secondary level, high school ELLs are expected to take and pass the State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness End-of-Course (STAAR/EOC) exams as part of their cumulative graduation requirements. Additionally, ELLs' performance on the STAAR exams at all grade levels significantly impacts their schools' and districts' adequate yearly progress (AYP). Subsequently, many schools and districts in

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the state continue to explore innovative ways to help ELLs effectively and efficiently acquire the academic English they need to succeed in school. This study examined a high school that piloted English as a Second Language (ESL) English and Reading courses delivered through a blended method of instruction in order to determine if the method increases students' language acquisition at a greater rate than students taking ESL English and Reading courses delivered via a traditional method of instruction as measured by Texas English Language Proficiency Assessment System (TELPAS) reading tests. Results indicate that there were no

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statistically significant differences in TELPAS 2013 reading scores between the group that received the blended method of instruction and the group that received the traditional method of instruction. The same was true in terms of STAAR English II reading scores, the differences between the groups were not statistically significant. ANOVA and ANCOVA did indicate a significant effect of TELPAS 2012 scores on TELPAS 2013 scores. Likewise there was a significant effect of STAAR English I reading scores on STAAR English II reading scores. Further, results indicated that there were significant differences in TELPAS 2013 reading scores based on instructional

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level, age, STAAR English I reading scores, and STAAR English II reading scores, but there were not significant differences based on gender and years in U.S. schools. As for STAAR English II reading scores, there were significant differences in scores based on instructional level, years in U.S. schools, and TELPAS 2012, yet no significant differences based on gender and age.

The purpose of this study was to examine the effect early college high school, in a Dallas, Texas large urban school district, on the academic performance of students in algebra I EOC, English I EOC, Biology, English II EOC, and the college readiness standards set by College Board on the PSAT. If a relationship existed, this

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study sought to determine students who participate in early college high school will have a higher success rate on the State of Texas Assessment of Academic Readiness (STAAR) and PSAT. In the state of Texas, state leaders were committed in closing the achievement gap and increase the number of minority students entering post-secondary institution. In 2006, Texas' first early college high school was established with the sole purpose to create an innovative high school that allows students least likely to attend college an opportunity to earn a high school diploma and up to 60 college credit hours. The researcher examined STAAR EOC scores in 2015–2016, and 2016 PSAT results compared to

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students in a traditional high school. The scores were analyzed using a one-way ANOVA. Overall, the strength of the relationship between ECHS and STAAR was significant. The relationship between ECHS and PSAT was also significant. The results of the study would suggest that the relationship of the early college high school program on student academic performance and PSAT total score was significant.

State data indicate that English Learners (ELs) in Texas public schools have the lowest high school graduation rate of all student groups, including special education. A 2015 policy change however, may be working to close the graduation gap in the state between ELs and English



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proficient students. In May of 2015, Senate Bill 149 (SB 149) became law and established local Individual Graduation Committees (IGCs) to review academic data on students who have not met state standard in time for graduation on the state's End of Course Exams (EOCs). After the IGC's review, and under certain conditions, the committee may reduce the number of EOCs required for high school graduation from 5 tests to any combination of 3 on which the student has met standard. A possible effect of this policy change is SB 149 and the associated IGC may provide greater benefit to ELs for public high school graduation than to English proficient students. Accordingly, I conducted a case study analysis at a

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large, urban high school in central Texas. My approach was based on several statistical techniques. Using Chi-square tests for independence I contrasted EL versus English proficient students for proportionality on graduation with and without the legislation. Next, I examined proportionality between ELs and English proficient students on the specific EOCs where the students applied SB 149 to graduate. Finally, I conducted a series of multiple linear regression analyses, including stepwise regression, to determine whether EL language proficiency data that are provided annually by the state might predict success or failure for these students when they are facing their final attempt at

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meeting standard on their English 2 EOC, typically the most difficult EOC for ELs. Some of the results were unexpected, and a new direction in 2018 on the state's annual English proficiency test added intrigue to the study, making for a timely discussion of implications for current and future educational policy in the state
